
























Class news

Class news

Class 1 – Mrs Betts

This week in Curious Quest, we have been reading 'The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark' by Jill Tomlinson. The children have been inventing a nocturnal character, creating a setting, and thinking about all the good things there are about the dark.

In reception, the children have now learnt, 'h, b, I, and f' and their new tricky word 'the'. They have also begun to write words such as 'dog, ten, red and mum'.

In maths, we have been learning about doubles and how these can help us calculate near doubles.

In reception, the children have been learning about patterns in numbers such as 1 more and 1 less using rhymes and stories.

In geography, we have been mapping the school using compasses. We have learnt mnemonics to help us remember our north, south, east and west. I wonder if you can remember what we say to help us remember the order of North, East, South, West?

In science, we have been learning about different habitats. This week we learnt about arctic animals and how they have adapted and why they are suited to their environment. I wonder why a polar bear is suited to the arctic habitat?

On Tuesday at 9:30 am, there is a Harvest Service at the church where the children will be performing. If you are able, please send in donations for the harvest food bank collection.

Class 2 - Mrs Miali

Our first full week in school for a while and it was just as enjoyable as the weeks we have been out on trips.

We started Monday delving into poetry, looking at kenning style poems. The class were quick to identify them in the Otter poem from *The Lost Words* and together created some superb kennings of their own about the otter. In the following lesson the children each chose an animal from British wildlife and using the previous weeks learning on synonyms, created a word bank of adjectives and interesting vocabulary about their animal. From this, they created their own kenning poems.

In maths, the children are looking at the method of column addition and subtraction. Next week they will use their learnt techniques to do inverse operations and estimate answers and then they will have completed the unit.

It was performance week in music and the children had a last practice with the instruments, for the sound effects they had created for their comic strips, before performing them for each other in class. They then had some time to work in small groups and create a theme tune for one of their comics.

The children have been sharing their PSHE knowledge, of how to work collaboratively, with class 1 in gymnastics. They are working together to perform their best jumping and balancing skills in a routine, ready to be filmed next week.
