

# RE- Pentecost

## Legacy

### Prior Knowledge

KS1: The children have studied the questions- Why do Christmas and Easter matter to Christians? What is the 'good news' Christians believe Jesus brings?

In KS2, they have completed work on the questions- What is the 'Trinity' and why is it important to Christians? Why do Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday'? What kind of world did Jesus want?



### My Component Knowledge:

Lesson 1: I can represent the 'Kingdom of God' that Christians believe Jesus wanted on Earth.

Lesson 2: I can retell the events of the Pentecost story.

Lesson 3: I can describe what Christians believe the Holy Spirit is like.

Lesson 4: I can explain what the 'Kingdom of God' would be like if the God described by Christians did rule.

Lesson 5: I understand that some people have different beliefs.

Lesson 6: I can recognise ways Christians celebrate the church's birthday and explain why Pentecost is an important event for Christians and how they believe God wanted the world to be.

### My Composite Knowledge:

I know the Pentecost story and can understand the impacts that it has for Christians today.

### My Powerful Knowledge:

I know when Pentecost is Celebrated and what it means to Christians today. I understand that some people have different beliefs and that we all have to choice to follow a religion as Christians do. I respect that some people choose not to have God as 'king' in their lives and can list some of the possible reasons for this.
