THE LEARNING ZONE





It was so lovely to see so many of you attend the breakfast on Thursday and I hoped you enjoyed looking at all the hard work that your children are producing in Geography, History and Science. I know that the children love it when they share their work with you.

In class we are continuing to work hard on our phonics - sound talking and blending are really starting to improve. We have been focusing on using tricky words as passwords and the children are beginning to recognise these by sight. **Great work Reception!**

In Drawing Club this week the Reception watched the animation Batfink, and created their own characters, secret lairs and adventures.

Year 1 and 2 are continuing their sequence on 'Lord of the Forest' they've been creating their own noun phrases, investigating direct speech and using prepositions in their writing.

While Year 2 are developing their understanding of Measurement, Year 1 are concentrating on Multiplication and Division. They have been counting in 2's, 5's and 10's and focussed on the language of equal and unequal.

Science this week has been about developing knowledge in animal classification and animal characteristics. In geography the children were using extending their map skills by using an atlas to locate places within the UK. Using the Bee-Bots in ICT, the children have been able to test their prediction skills to check algorithms in deepen their understanding.

Class 2 This week, Years 3, 4 and 5 have had another fantastic day at Forest School. Each week they work on developing their skills in all areas, including cooking, knife skills, fire lighting etc.

On Thursday, we had our Family Breakfast event. It was lovely to see so many of you come to see what your children have been doing, thank you.

In English, the children have completed their sequence of work on 'Kensuke's Kingdom'. It is always a pleasure to hear children talking about how much they have enjoyed hearing a story and this one has proved very popular. They have written their own version of the story from the point at which Michael (the main character) finds himself alone on an island. Some of their ideas included their character being stranded in a desert, on the moors and in the Arctic.

In Maths, Years 3 and 4 have started a unit of work on Money. They have been recapping pounds and pence, as well as adding and estimating money. Years 5 and 6 have completed their work on Converting Units by learning about and comparing imperial measures with metric measures.

Other lessons have included researching the landscapes of South America, experimenting with eggs and different liquids to observe changes to the shell (in connection with teeth), finding out about the heart, what a baptism is and writing a eulogy for Queen Elizabeth II.

child off school?



Until...

at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
48 hours after their last episode
they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
4 days after the rash first appeared
5 days after the swelling started
they've had their first treatment
24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
