Class 1 – Mrs Betts

An exciting start to the week going over to Winkleigh for the pantomime performance. The children had a lovely time playing and learning with their peers. Then on Monday, Winkleigh's Year ones and twos visited Kings Nympton to participate in gymnastics. It was a wonderful events and we really enjoyed hosting Winkleigh.

We have been using number lines in KS1 Maths this week, and using our skills to work out missing numbers as well as estimating where numbers would be. Reception have been learning about the flat shapes triangles and circles. They have been on a shape hunt and they have investigated circles and triangles within 3d shapes. They also made some great shape printing.

Reception have been learning about what makes us the same or different, and being kind. They have also been playing turn taking games to make sure that everyone has fun. KS1 have also been learning about what makes them the same and different to other members of our class, and that it's ok to like different things or look different.

This week in history, we have learnt about the amazing Mary Seacole another significant nurse. The children were starting to compare her to Florence Nightingale noting that although they were similar they were also different.

Thank you for all attending parents evening this week – it was lovely to speak with you all in person.

It's been another busy, but enjoyable week for the class. With festivities already on some of their minds, the pantomime on Monday has them all thinking about Christmas and all the fun we have to look forward to.

This was followed by a full on morning, where we welcomed the Year 1 and 2 pupils from Winkleigh to participate, together with Class 1, in gymnastics at our village hall. Class 2 children were fantastic ambassadors; supporting and encouraging all the younger pupils. They demonstrated some beautiful gymnastic skill and helped others come up with ideas and feel confident in their performances – Well done Class 2 you are incredible role models.

Inspired by a bit of Creature Comforts, the class have given their animals some character and personality in their interviews for English. They have been finding that balance of providing factual information in an engaging way for the reader.

In maths, we have moved onto 3, 6 and 9 time tables. Again, looking at the relationship between the numbers and any patterns to help recall speed, as well as using partitioning and repeat addition to help with more challenging multiplication sums. The children had fun learning the trick with their fingers to help with their 9 times tables.

Their D&T projects are progressing well and they are looking forward to adding the characters and objects of their scene onto the moving mechanisms over the coming weeks.

Information about parts, lines and costume ideas for the Christmas play will be coming home next week. Please encourage the children to practice their lines.


