Class 1 – Mrs Betts

In KS1, we've started our Curious Quest at last! To make the magic happen the children had to know the elements of a sentence and write one. Professor Klunk was super impressed with their understanding and their sentence writing. Our inspiration for writing this week was the animated 'Kipper and the Conker Tree' by Mick Inkpen. The children created their own characters, setting and problem and finished with a celebration.

Reception have learnt even more sounds this week, and their blending of CVC words is brilliant. They have been using our passwords 'I' and 'is' if they need to leave the classroom.

In maths, KS1 have been learning their number bonds to both 10 and 20. **These are really important for mental calculations any support at home for these will greatly benefit learning.** Reception have been learning about the order of numbers and counting things they can feel and hear.

In PE, we are joining up with Class 2 for gymnastics in the hall and the focus has been on jumping and balance. The children used a spring board this week, and learnt about the importance of jumping and landing safely.

In RE, the children have been thinking about how Christians use prayers.

In Geography, we went for a village walk to notice human and physical features of our environment.

We have our last forest school this week! So, for the last time this year, watch out for our Facebook posts to see what exciting things your children have been learning.

Class 2 - Mrs Miali

It has been another busy week in Class 2. The children have started their new English sequence of poetry and have enjoyed listening to the poems in the book. The Lost Words, is a magical book of spells, bringing nature to life. The class have already written some poems of their own, inspired by natural objects from around the school.


In maths they have been recapping their number bond facts, to 10, 20 and 100, to help with addition and subtraction sums. They have played some quick-fire games to make the connections between the number bonds easier.

For music, the class have been linking their sound knowledge from science to making sound effects for cartoons. They have learnt that the pitch of a sound changes depending on the size of a character. They had lots of fun exploring all the different instruments and playing them, in not so traditional ways, to decide what sound effect they could be used for in their own cartoon strip.

The children had an amazing time at the Eden project on Wednesday. Becoming 'Rainforest Rangers,' they were able to explore the different levels of the rainforest biome, studying the plant life and seeing how they can be used for food, water and shelter.
