Additionally, they have been learning about symmetry first noticing symmetry in nature, and then in shapes.



## Class 2 - Mrs Miali

The class have had a lovely week, balancing their work with festive activities.

The children have so many ideas and are keen to start writing their final piece in English, so we have secured their understanding of direct speech and how to punctuate it correctly, so that they can include conversations between characters in their writing. We also looked at the variation in sentence length, to grab the attention of the reader, so that their final pieces are interesting and make the reader want to read on. I am looking forward to reading their stories.

In the final unit of this year for maths, we have been exploring area and how to measure and compare the area of rectilinear shapes. Counting squares has been a favoured method, but the children have learnt how they can use their timetables knowledge to more efficiently calculate the area of a shape.

On Tuesday the whole school came together to enjoy our Christmas dinner. There was turkey and stuffing, crackers and music and the lovely company of Mrs Rainger and Elizabeth from the local community. The meal was delicious.

We came together again to sing Christmas carols around the village tree on Thursday. The children sang beautifully and it was lovely to see some familiar faces enjoying the festivities.

Next week, we have a festive day of Christmas games at Winkleigh on Monday; our Christmas play, Snowman at sunset, on Tuesday and the church carol service Wednesday morning. If you could please find some time for your child to go over their lines, so they're feeling as ready as can be to perform to an audience that would be much appreciated.

Remember-Set up devices!

With Christmas almost upon us, Scomis would like to take this opportunity to remind you of some important safety points to consider if your child is likely

- SMART device (TV, Speaker)
- new mobile phone
- games console
- tablet PC

to receive a:

#### Check:

- the device is working correctly
- the device is fully charged
- the parental controls
- the safety settings
- filtering is applied to your home's WI-FI

#### Finally:

Don't leave setting up the device before you wrap it up!

Check the UK Safer Internet's 4 tips for giving tech gifts this Christmas including:

Discuss your expectations—make sure everyone understands the importance of staying stay safe.

## Create a family agreement - a brilliant way:

- to think about how your family uses the inter-
- to help make sure that everybody understands the importance of staying safe and being responsible online.

#### You could include:

- daily screentime allowances
- where the device is kept at night
- approving friend requests
- permission to download or purchase apps
- use of social media Remember most social media sites have a minimum age of 13!

- Internet connected devices can send and receive data
- respond to voice commands and be controlled remotely using a smartphone app.

## If not set up properly, the risks include:

- Developers or hackers may be connected to your device without your knowledge
- Baby monitors, children's tablets, drone toys, can be hacked and used by people outside of your home.
