

Class 1 – Mrs Betts

Reception are working hard on learning their new phonemes in phonics this week 'g, o, c'.

We are already beginning to read words and are learning our first tricky word 'is'. Any games you can play i.e. hiding the word or showing it as a password to read, would be hugely beneficial for your child's reading.

The children are also really focusing on the pre-cursive letter formations.

In Curious Quest, class one have met their new faithful friends and have been writing letters to them to persuade them to help us on our new adventure.

In maths, KS1 have just finished their Place Value unit. While reception children have been learning about sets and examining buttons for things that are the same and those that are different.

Class news

Class 2 - Mrs Miali

The children arrived at school Monday buzzing after their first forest school of the year and the excitement has continued through the week.

On Monday morning we focused on the new spelling words and created fun sentences to remember the homophones and phonic sounds. They have also enjoyed using their spelling words in the handwriting time to get some extra practice.

Tuesday was a fabulous day, with the best of the weather for the school trip. The class enjoyed exploring all sorts of different habitats and learning about the different animals they could and did find in the rock pools and in the burrows. They are looking forward to recalling their experiences of the day when we look at living things and their habitats in science, after half term.

We continue with our English sequence and the children have completed lots of hunting through the text to find conjunctions, subordinate clauses and noun phrases. This has inspired them to write their own subordinate clauses and noun phrases about the person they have focused on.

For Maths they have been effectively using their place value knowledge to round two and three digit numbers to the nearest multiple of 10 and 100. One more week of place value, to include roman numerals and then we move on to addition and subtraction.

The children have been learning to work collaboratively in PSHE and looking at the skills needed to achieve success. They created a fantastic human machine, deciding what actions were needed and how best to perform them to create a pizza. They have also pulled on these skills when planning a science experiment that they will be conducting next week.

We have another busy week to look forward to, with the pond dipping trip on Monday, family breakfast Thursday and forest school on Friday. Don't forget drop off is 9:15am at Cadbury Cottages and collection from the same location at 3:00pm on Monday.
