Dear Parents/Carers

It has been a joy to see the children after the half term holiday and hear all about their holiday adventures. They have certainly had fun in our newly organised classroom where we have dedicated more space to a 'home corner'. They have been coming up with different play scenarios involving recipes, shops and working in an office usually involving talking on the phone and taking messages!

This week in the nursery we've also been exploring the classic story Dear Zoo by Rod Campbell! The children have absolutely loved joining in with the repeated phrases, guessing which animal might be hiding in each crate, and talking about why each animal wasn't quite right for a pet.

We have compared animal sizes, counted how many legs each had, and sorted toy animals by colour and pattern. The children have enjoyed creating their own animal to display in the classroom.

Owls (Reception) – Miss Batstone & Mrs Rowcliffe

The Owls have had a wonderfully busy week filled with excitement, curiosity, and hands-on learning. In maths, the children have been strengthening their understanding of number bonds to 10, using practical activities and games to build confidence and fluency. They worked brilliantly together and showed great perseverance.

As we approached Bonfire Night, the class explored the story behind the celebration, learning about fireworks, sparklers, and the traditions that make this time of year so special. A highlight of the week was a surprise visit from "Guy Fawkes" himself, who helped bring history to life in a fun and memorable way. The children were also fascinated by a collection of historical artefacts, including Victorian photographs, jewellery, and many other intriguing objects.

Handling these items sparked thoughtful questions and lively discussions, giving everyone a chance to experience history first-hand. Well done, Owls, for an inspiring and enthusiastic week of learning!













Year 1 – Mrs Roberts

It has been lovely to be back together to start this half term, we have updated the construction and role play areas to include an outer space area. Year 1 have moved to the cabin for all of their focused teaching and children continue to use the pod along with Year 2s for their independent work. We are very lucky to have such a fantastic Key Stage 1 environment with lots of resources for hands-on, practical learning. The children have settled back in well!

In Maths, we have continued our addition and subtraction learning sequence, strengthening our understanding of number bonds within 10 as well as adding number within 10. We even took our learning outside this week, using chalk to write and solve number sentences on the playground!

In English, we have continued our Curious Quests, taking inspiration from the book Oi! Frog! The children have thoroughly enjoyed inventing their own ideas and characters and creating some very funny rules and rhymes for where animals should sit!

Thursday was History day and year 1 had a special visitor from 400 years ago, Guy Fawkes! He told us about his failed plot to get rid of King James I, and how we all now celebrate this failed plan on the 5th November every year. The children thought carefully about questions to ask Guy Fawkes and helped him to retell the story in the correct sequence.

Finally, just a gentle reminder that reading books are changed on Tuesdays. Please ensure that books are returned to school so that we can exchange them for new ones. We do ask children to hand their message books in if they have a message, please remind your child if you have written a message as we do not check every book daily.

Year 2 – Mrs Keast

Well done Year 2 on a great first week back following half term. This week has been full of focused learning and expereicens

In English, Year 2 have been exploring the John Lewis "Man on the Moon" advert. We discussed the meaning of "heartwarming" and how emotions can be shown without words. The children enjoyed watching the video, sharing ideas, and describing how it made them feel — a wonderful start to our new writing focus.

In Maths, Year 2 have been learning to add two 2-digit numbers using column addition. Although this has been a challenge, the children have shown great perseverance, working hard to master the method. They've confidently applied their addition skills and number bond knowledge to solve problems.

We have adapted our Key Stage 1 learning environment to build on our wonderful continuous provision space in the conservatory. This area offers role play, small world, construction and writing opportunities, allowing the children to explore, learn, and apply their skills through independent activities, whilst maintaining focused teaching areas for both classes.

On Thursday the children enjoyed History Day and learned about Robert Falcon Scott as part of our 'Explorers' sequence. The afternoon included our first Forest School lesson which was great fun for the class to be outside enjoying our outdoor environment.

Year 3 – Mrs Bourner

We have had a great first week back in Year Three this week, the highlight of which has to be our trip to Exeter on Wednesday. The children loved meeting up with their friends from Kings Nympton to board the train at Eggesford and thoroughly enjoyed the train journey, even making friends with a local guide dog! They were a real credit to the federation during our tour of the Cathedral, asking some great questions, listening carefully to the history of the cathedral, and spotting all the different features. They were all definitely ready for pizzas at midday! On Thursday we spent time thinking about our new history topic; The Ancient Egyptians. The children enjoyed learning about heiroglyphics and had fun trying to write their own names using these ancient symbols whilst creating their own cartouches. Our new English sequence - Paddington, has been a real hit too, and linked nicely with our own voyage to Exeter on the train this week! Year 4 – Mr Walter

I hope everyone enjoyed their half term! It's been lovely to see everyone return eager to learn and ready to take on the new term. In English, we've started developing our understanding of writing speech, learning how to use inverted commas correctly and exploring how dialogue can bring characters to life in our writing. In Maths, we've been making connections between the multiples of 3, 6 and 9 as part of our multiplication and division sequence. The children have been working hard to spot patterns and strengthen their times tables knowledge. On Wednesday, we had a visit from the RNLI, who delivered an informative session on water safety. The children enjoyed learning how to stay safe near water and asked some brilliant questions. This term, we have introduced a new weekly music club. We enjoyed listening to music from around the world, trying to guess where in the world it was from. Thank you Miss McLean for organising this for us. Whilst on Thursday we focussed on a history day with mystery objects to discuss. Throughout the term, we will continue with our daily reading, spelling and handwriting sessions. At home, children can keep practising using Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS), Rollama, and Letter-join to support their learning in fun and interactive ways. Have a great weekend, stay safe and enjoy the fireworks for all who are attending.

Year 5 – Mr Saltearn

It has been great to welcome Year 5 back after half term. In English, we have continued with our sequence about Kensukes Kingdom and have been focusing on becoming familiar with the text. We have read up to chapter 5 and this week have been creating our own poem as if we were lost at sea, thinking about how we can build tension and the vocabulary that we are choosing and how we can edit and improve our writing. We have also been thinking about the descriptions in the book and how they make us think about. In groups we listened to the descriptions from the book and tried to create what we imagined the island to look like on paper. In Maths, we have been converting improper fractions to mixed number fractions, the children enjoyed being outside and using our class to make improper fractions and convert them to mixed number fractions. On Thursday, we enjoyed our History day, asking questions about mystery objects and we even got to experience Victorian PE. This linked brilliantly with our trip to Morwellham Quay today – pictures will be included within next week's newsletter.









Year 6 - Miss McLean

This week in English, we have been getting to know our new text The Northern Lights by Phillip Pullman. The children have used some of Phillip Pullman's writing techniques to have a go at writing their own fantasy setting descriptions based on a real place.

We have started our first sequence on fractions in maths this week. The children have been using their prior knowledge to look at equivalent fractions and write them in their simplest forms. We also started new sequences in all of the foundation subjects. More information about these can be found on the school website on the cover sheets for each subject.

On Thursday, we had a history day learning about the Tudor period, our history focus for this half term. The children learnt about the Tudor monarchs and worked in groups to create a Tudor family tree. The also spent some time building a model of a Tudor house.
