Year 1— Mrs Keast

We were green-fingered this week in Year One. The text that we have been reading in our Curious Quest was 'Grow Your Own Lettuce'. We have been learning about writing instructions and thinking about how to be prepared for planting. What equipment do we need?

In Maths, we have been learning about fractions. We have found half of an object or quantity and are moving onto quarters. Can you find something at home that you could share into halves or quarters?

In Art this week we have continued to learn about Henri Matisse and his collage pieces. We enjoyed looking at "*Beasts of the Sea*" and then creating our own pieces from coloured paper. We will be collaborating with our peers to create a group collage next time.

Please can all children bring their water bottles and their reading record (polar bear books) so that we are able to record their reading daily. We are looking forward to our 'Geography Day' on Wednesday next week and our Infant Music Festival on Thursday afternoon.









Year 2—Mr Slocombe

Year 2 have had another great week! We have been busy telling the time in maths, reading the *Bad-tempered ladybird* and showing the times mentioned on clocks.

We have begun to tell the time using the vocabulary past and to. We are doing this for each of the intervals of 5-minutes on the analogue clock.

Meanwhile, in English, we have been writing our own weather books; considering a variety of weather conditions and extreme weathers. Next week, we will be travelling across the sea with Mr Grinling in the Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch!

Science has seen us test the properties of plastic, deciding whether it would be any good to recommend as a construction material for the three little pigs.

Art transported us to the 1960s, learning all about the societal changes and the popular artwork of the time.

Year 3- Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Manning

This week has been full of discovery and creativity in our classroom!

Children have been busy presenting their research on unusual flowers, inspired by the beautifully illustrated *Big Book of Blooms*. Each student created their own fact-filled and artistic page, showcasing fascinating floral discoveries from around the world.

In our PHSE lessons, we've been learning about the importance of a balanced diet and which foods help keep our bodies strong and healthy. The children enjoyed exploring food groups and making links to their own eating habits.

We've delved deeper into the concept of time in maths, focusing on reading both analogue and digital clocks, understanding intervals of time, and solving real-life time problems. *Keep practising telling the time at home to build confidence!*

In Geography, the class has been investigating the mountain ranges of Poland. From the Tatra Mountains to the Sudetes, the children have learned about their locations, features, and even some of the wildlife found there.

Well done to all the children for their hard work and enthusiasm this week!



Year 4-Mr Walter

In Year 4, we have started to focus on our new sequence of '*Arthur and the Golden Rope*', focussing on a boy who needs to go on a quest to save his village. This week, we have thought carefully about the layout of the text whilst asking questions that we feel the author has left unanswered.

In maths, we are coming to the end of our decimal sequence. We have been working on comparing and ordering decimals whilst rounding to the nearest integer. Next week, we will move onto our sequence of time. *I wonder if you could track how long you have slept for over the weekend?*

We have also used atlases to find the capital cities in North America whilst exploring classification keys in science. Also, we had a great time challenging ourselves with the hurdles in PE. Next Wednesday, we look forward to our school geography day when we focus on the continent of Asia. *If anyone has anything that they would want to share that links with this topic, you are more than welcome to bring it in.*
