Owls have had a great second week back. We have continued to look at dinosaurs, and have started to categorise them under “carnivore”, “herbivore” and “omnivore”, thinking about a dinosaurs features and how this relates to what they eat.

In PSHE we have been thinking about ourselves, our bodies, and how medicine makes us feel better.

We have also continued our drawing club journey by reading Dinosaur Time by Michael Foreman.

The children have loved creating their own characters and thinking about where they will “go” and who they will “meet”.

We have had children being “chased by raptors”, using “codes” to get help from Numberblocks, and “codes” that make the sky turn purple!

It has been wonderful to see their imagination being sparked by the freedom to create with no limits.

Year 1 – Mrs Roberts

What a lovely week in Year 1! In Maths, we continued our learning on place value within 20. The children enjoyed using resources and manipulatives to understand that numbers like 13 are made up of 10 and 3. In Art, we explored primary and secondary colours and used our knowledge to create beautiful rainbows, mixing colours and getting creative.

In Geography, we learned about Sri Lanka and created fact files. The children loved smelling, feeling, and looking at some of the foods, spices, and tea produced on this island country.

In PE, we practised using tennis rackets and enjoyed passing the ball to each other.

In Science, we looked at the wide variety of mammals and discussed what makes them special.

In English, we continued our Curious Quest with the book *The Train Ride* by June Crebbin. On Wednesday, the children were sent home with login details for the Collins Online Library. If these did not make it home, please let us know and we will send new logins.

Year 2 – Mrs Keast

Year Two have been working hard on their writing this week, composing paragraphs as part of our sequence on non-fiction writing. We have been researching space and the solar system so that we are ready to create our final piece of independent writing next week.

In maths, we have been focusing on multiplication and division. We have been learning how to use the multiplication symbol correctly within a number sentence. We have also begun to use arrays and organise items into equal groups in order to divide.

We have learned about human life cycles in science. The class enjoyed talking about how humans change throughout their lifetime and could identify some of the physical changes to our bodies.

The children have enjoyed accessing our continuous provision area, particularly the vets role play which has some fantastic real-life resources for us to use, thanks to Maisie's Mum!

Year 3 – Mrs Bourner

In Year 3 this week, the children have continued to focus on the tale of Hansel and Gretel in English thinking about direct speech, conjunctions and past and present tense verbs. We will be putting these skills together next week to write our own stories. In maths, they have enjoyed learning different ways to divide and show their workings. Lolly sticks, place value counters and part whole models have all been used this week. What great maths Year 3, well done. On Wednesday, the children enjoyed researching the county we live in, thinking about why people might visit Devon, what famous people come from Devon and of course what visitors might eat. A rather heated discussion was had on scones and the 'correct' order of cream and jam! In PE this week, the children worked well together in teams thinking about how to plan and organise themselves to solve problems. We are very much looking forward to our Science day next Thursday and can't wait to see what everyone will come dressed as! Have a lovely restful weekend.



Year 4 – Mr Walter

This week in English, we explored and compared the setting descriptions in the text Varjak Paw.

We also had fun using dictionaries to find definitions of unknown words before writing a letter from a chosen character's perspective. In maths, we continued to embed our understanding of multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100. Our next steps will be securing informal and formal methods of both operations. We are looking forward to science day next week. In preparation we have focused on the symbols for electrical components that make a circuit before testing our own simple circuits, ensuring we draw our scientific diagrams accurately. In geography, we learnt about renewable and non-renewable resources, sorting them into the correct category. In RE, we also focused on discussion but this time our objective was describing the significance of water in Christianity.

Thank you for your understanding with our postponed football event alongside Year 3 this week. We will update with a new date in due course.

Year 5 – Mr Saltearn

A great week in Year 5 this week! In English, we have been focusing on our book *The Lost Words* and have been creating our own poems based on an animal. We have been focusing on using a range of vocabulary and poetic devices.

In Maths, we have finished our sequence on multiplication and division and have been practicing our division skills using short division. Yesterday, we started our new sequence on fractions and have been multiplying unit fractions by an integer.

In Geography, we have been learning how to use an Atlas to find famous rivers around the world. We identified a river and used our new skills of using an atlas to plot the river on a world map and then create a fact file about them using the atlas as a base for knowledge.

Year 6 – Miss McLean

Year 6 have been getting stuck into their shared writing towards the end of this week and have been making great use of the grammar features we have learnt about recently to create some well crafted story openings. Next week, they are looking forward to writing their independent pieces and creating their own characters and settings. In maths, we have been looking at decimals. The children have used their prior knowledge of place value, rounding, addition and subtraction to calculate with decimals. We discussed the importance of understanding the agreements that websites and apps set out before clicking accept on a pop-up in computing this week. The children were surprised to learn about the data that someone could be giving permission for others to access when clicking 'allow' in these situations. We hadn't all previously thought much about what data could be collected and for what reasons. Next week, we are looking forward to science day on Thursday. The children are invited to come dressed up as a scientist of their choice to celebrate the day.
