This week we have looked at the book 'Jack and The Beanstalk' as part of our Drawing club sequence. Our new vocabulary has been: disguise, booming, hastily, magnificent, furious, ginormous and ascend. It is wonderful to hear the children using the words we learn in drawing club as part of their everyday chatter in class, they are developing a wonderfully rich vocabulary.

In maths we have been learning about time and the children have enjoyed listening to a range of stories linked to this theme.

As part of our RE topic we are thinking about new life, growth and change, and the children have enjoyed searching for signs of Spring as well as planting beans which we hope won't grow quite as tall as Jack's beanstalk!

Year 1— Mrs Keast

Year One have been on a Curious Quest with some bugs this week. We read 'I Love Bugs' by Emma Dodd. We have been very creative, designing our own bug catchers and writing instructions for building a big hotel. We have been working hard on our sentence formation and have been re-reading our writing to check it makes sense.

In Maths, we have been working on numbers to 50. We have been working out the number of tens and ones in a two-digit number. We have been looking at how much easier it is to count a larger number if the objects are placed in groups of ten.

In RE we have been learning about Holy Week and The Easter Story. We created our own Calvary Hill scenes and thought about the key events in Holy Week.

Next week we are looking forward to World Book Day on Thursday. We have some fun

book-based activities to enjoy.







Year 2—Mr Slocombe

Year 2 have had a great first week back. On Monday, we welcomed Holly to our class to discuss her role as a nurse. We are beginning our sequence around Significant Nurses of the past in History and it was brilliant to be able to find out more about nursing today.

In Science, we began our unit about plants by planting our own cress seeds in pairs, we look forward to watching them grow over the next few weeks.

Maths saw us learning more about fractions. We have recapped our learning about part-whole models, before learning about recognising and finding halves.

In English, we have been looking at our new text of *Stuck!* by Oliver Jeffers. This involved sequencing the objects from the story before learning more about adverbs and their role in the text.

I am looking forward to seeing what everyone is dressed up as for World Book Day on Thursday!

Year 3— Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Manning

Year 3s had a great week this week. They had an exciting and educational trip to Kent's Cavern. They were fascinated by the incredible rock formations and the underground caverns they explored during the guided tour. They learned about the geology of the caves, including how stalactites and stalagmites are formed over thousands of years. The highlight of the day was handling some replica skulls from the caves previous inhabitants and some real artefacts that were used by them tens of thousands of years ago. They really showed what excellent learners they were and came back with a wealth of new knowledge that they built on previous learning. They have begun a new teaching sequence on The Great Fire of London, a chronological recount of the fire. They will use this additional research and their trip to the caves to write their own chronological report of the cave, from its beginning to its present day.













Year 4—Mr Walter

It has been great to welcome Year 4 back following half term! I hope everyone had an enjoyable break.

This week, we have been busy exploring our new teaching sequences. In science, we investigated how we hear vibrations linking to our topic of sound. In history, we enjoyed using some of the loaned items from Tiverton Museum to link with our 20th century leisure activities and in RE we discussed key vocabulary linking Christianity and Easter.

In English, we have created our own independent writes about our selected gemstone characters linking with our learning of Blue John. Whereas in maths we have continued to convert fractions between improper and mixed number fractions to allow us to show the different representations.

Well done to everyone who completed the level 1 Bikeability course on Wednesday! We had some great feedback from all! Level 2 for next year is already being arranged.

Next Thursday, is World Book Day! We are looking forward to seeing the amazing creativity of the costumes. Additionally, we will be collecting in any Sport for Champions sponsorship forms and money. Thank you to all handed in so far.

Year 5— Mr Saltearn

A fantastic first week back in Year 5. In English, we have started our new sequence and book, 'Cloud Busting'. We have started to read the book and have been writing our own recount poems about what has happened so far in the book. On Thursday, we wrote our own Haikus about different seasons and then about a character that we have read about in the book so far.

In Maths, we have been working in random groups and thinking about our reasoning and critical thinking. We have looked at different challenges and the children have enjoyed working with different people and investigating why something is happening. The children have enjoyed the creative way of recording their findings.

In History, we have started our new sequence on Vikings and have started to build a timeline of key events.

In PE, we have been practicing our bowling in cricket and applying our skills into a game situation.

Year 6—Miss McLean

Year Six have thrown themselves into our new sequences across the curriculum, especially our English. The children have been looking forward to starting the Harry Potter sequence and have enthusiastically been writing some howler letters.

In maths we have started the half-term with geometry. We have recapped using a protractor and finding missing angles in a right angle, on a straight line and in triangles.

We have started learning about the Shang Dynasty in history, making links back to the Bronze age which they learnt about in year 3. We also spent our first History lesson learning about the Shang Dynasty kings and tried to order them as accurately as possible. In science, we will be learning about evolution and inheritance and in RE we will be answering the question 'Why do Hindus try to be good?'

FUNDRAISING



On Thursday 13th March 2025 we will welcome Kirsty Way as our Sports for Champions athlete.

Every child has been given a sponsorship form to try and help raise funds which will be split between the federation (60%) and the athlete (40%). The whole school will have the opportunity to ask questions and participate in a fitness circuit with Kirsty Way. She is a European champion in double mini trampolining (DMT). This is a fantastic opportunity for a lot of children to learn about a sport they otherwise might not get to engage with and hear the story of an athlete on their journey to try and achieve success. Kirsty has strong links with other aspects of gymnastics and will spend time with each class throughout the morning.

The form given explains more information regarding the event itself and some rewards available for certain amounts of sponsorships. A child will still be able to participate in the event without sponsorship. Our previous events funds have helped us purchase new equipment like goals and basketball hoops as well maintaining our playgrounds and subsidising trips and events throughout the academic year.

Reporting Absences

To report your child absent please do so by telephoning the school and choosing Option 1 to leave a message on the absence line. You can also report an absence through the Gateway app.





Should I keep my

child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
