Dear Parents/Carers,

Trips & Activities

Year 1 – Exmoor Zoo

Year 1 had a brilliant educational visit to Exmoor Zoo last Friday, exploring real-life examples of animals they've been learning about in class. They spotted favourites like meerkats, cheetahs, pumas, and lemur monkeys, and were thrilled to see a snake called Pumpkin and a giant Australian stick insect. Bonnie said, "I loved the caiman, which was hard to spot in the water," and Malia bravely touched a live snake, saying, "I don't like snakes, I'm scared of them," but couldn't pass up the opportunity to meet one. The children used their scientific vocabulary to classify animals, linking this to the five vertebrate groups and making connections across science, maths, and computing through sorting, grouping, and observation. It was a fun, hands-on way to bring learning to life.

Owls – RHS Rosemoor

On Tuesday, Owls had a wonderful visit to Rosemoor, where they enjoyed exploring the beautiful gardens alongside peers from across the federation. The children had great fun collecting leaves of all shapes and sizes—some as big as their heads, others as tiny as their fingers. They carefully searched for different colours, matching their leaves to the rainbow they spotted around the garden. It was a fantastic hands-on experience that encouraged curiosity, teamwork, and observation, as the children shared their discoveries and celebrated the variety of nature together.

This week in the nursery, we have been embracing the wonderful season of spring! The children have shown great curiosity as we explored the changes happening around us, especially focusing on flowers and patterns.

This Week's Highlights:

We talked about how flowers grow and what they need to thrive, such as sunlight, water, and care. The children enjoyed observing different types of flowers and noticing their bright colours, shapes, and sizes.

Pattern Fun:

A big part of our learning has been all about patterns! The children explored patterns in a variety of ways:

- Creating repeating patterns using coloured petals and leaves
- Printing flower shapes with paint to make beautiful designs
 - Spotting patterns in nature, such as petals on flowers
 - Making their own patterns using beads and blocks

Through these activities, the children are developing skills in:

- Early maths (recognising and creating patterns)
- Language development (learning new spring vocabulary)
 - Fine motor skills (cutting, sticking, and painting)
 - Understanding the world around them

Going on a spring walk and spotting flowers together

Creating simple patterns with everyday objects (e.g., spoon–fork–spoon–fork)

Talking about colours and shapes you see in nature


Class news

Owls (Reception) – Miss Batstone & Miss Crosby

Owls have had a great week. We continued our exploration of all things “growing” and lifecycles. The children have shown great understanding of what a lifecycle is and demonstrated their knowledge well during our Rosemoor trip on Tuesday. We planted our own pea seeds, collected different leaves and created our own wax resist artwork of them. The children had a great time and loved going out on the bus!

During Drawing club this week, we have been looking at “bagpuss”. The children were fascinated by the start in black and white. We talked all about how television has changed through the years. They thoroughly enjoyed creating their own characters from dinosaurs to different cats and thinking about what “Emily” could use to collect lost things.

During maths we have begun to compare numbers within 10. Strengthening our understanding of number bonds and subitising. We have been using part-whole models and 5s and 10s frames to represent numbers and explore the bonds we can see (without counting). What a great week!



Class news

Year 1 – Mrs Roberts

The children were excited to have a sneak peek at the new play park at Elm Meadow. We had some great discussions about how the equipment might be transported and how it is assembled ready for use.

In Maths, we concluded our learning on length and height and have now begun a new unit on mass and volume. In English, we started our new learning sequence based on the story Dogger. The children really enjoyed describing Dogger and creating missing posters and extending their writing by giving explanation. In Science, we learned about the sense of touch and taste - the children enjoyed tasting a variety of foods and practised describing the different flavours.

In RE, we explored what Easter eggs symbolise in the Christian faith and had some thoughtful discussions. In History, we continued our learning about the Great Fire of London. This week, we explored how firefighting has changed over time, including the methods used during the fire and the equipment firefighters use today.

In PE, our fitness lesson focused on speed and stamina. The children thoroughly enjoyed completing the different outdoor courses during a brief moment of sunshine!

It was lovely to speak to so many of you at parents' evening this week—thank you for your continued support.

Year 2 – Mrs Keast

Year Two were very interested to learn about temperature in maths this week. We looked at the weather forecast and the predicted temperature before heading outside to test it for ourselves. We talked about the temperature differences between outside and inside. Later in the week we took part in some practical measure activities, using various containers to measure volumes of water. We also discussed the difference between capacity and volume. In English, we have been working on some of our grammar, linked to the text 'War Dog'. We have been using vocabulary from the text, changing sentences to include possessive apostrophes and converting present tense sentences into past tense. Next week we will be rewriting the story independently. The writing that we produce is going to be sent to The Royal British Legion in Okehampton. We are looking forward to sharing our final piece of writing with some members of the wider community who are interested in military history.

We had an informative visit from Cultural Champion Neomi Alam on Wednesday. Neomi shared her experiences of being raised as a British Bangladeshi Muslim. This gave us some great opportunities to make links to our learning about Islam in RE this term and we were able to ask her many questions about her faith. We enjoyed learning about her daily routine, prayer and charitable giving.



Class news

Year 3 – Mrs Bourner

There has been a flurry of excited writing in Year Three this week linked to our English text! The children have written some fantastic letters, instructions and passages to introduce their monster. They are very much looking forward to creating their own Monster guide book next week! We had a very busy maths activity on Thursday this week where the children practised using their skills of reading scales to weigh a variety of different items. I wonder if you have any scales at home to practice these skills? Maybe you could bake a cake or weigh some of the items from your cupboard? It was lovely to welcome Neomi Allan into school on Wednesday. She talked to the children about her Muslim faith, shared photographs, rosary beads and the Qu'ran, as well as demonstrating how Muslims pray. The children asked some fantastic questions and shared their own learning from last term with her. Well done to everyone who took part in our cross-country events this week both in school and also at Monkleigh on Wednesday. Have a lovely restful weekend Year Three.



Year 4 – Mr Walter

Year 4 have had a wonderfully busy week of learning. In English, the children have continued exploring our topic *What a Waste* by writing diary entries from the perspective of a piece of rubbish, focusing on expressing feelings and emotions. They also took part in a litter pick around the school grounds, gathering information and photographs to create their own PowerPoint presentations, which they look forward to sharing during a whole-school assembly. Their aim has been to use rhetorical questions and emotive language to encourage others to take care of our environment. In maths, the class have completed their work on fractions by learning how to subtract from a whole and how to work with mixed-number fractions. They will now be moving on to a new sequence on decimals. In history, the children produced persuasive writing to explain the importance of boosting morale during the London 1948 Olympics and how the event helped lift the nation after the war. Everyone enjoyed a fantastic cross-country event organised by Mr Jarad on Thursday afternoon, earning points for their tree groups. We would also like to congratulate the children who represented the school at the Monkleigh cross-country event, they have worked very hard at running club over the last few weeks with Mr Slocombe, Mr Craker and me. Thank you for taking the time to attend parents evening this week. It was great to share progress with you all.




Class news

Year 5 – Mr Saltearn



Year 5 have had a fantastic week this week. In Maths, we have finished our sequence on statistics and have been practicing our skills of reading and interpreting different tables. In English, this week we have been finishing our sequence on Cloud Busting and have been drafting and editing our final isn't life.... poems. It has been great to hear the children come up with their ideas about what makes life for them.

This week in History we have been learning about what made the Vikings successful when raiding the monasteries. On Thursday, Year 5 along with the rest of KS2 taking part in Mr Jarad's cross country event, it was fantastic to see the children display resilience throughout their run. Have a great weekend Year 5.



Year 6 – Miss McLean

Year 6 have continued with their Harry Potter sequence in English this week. They have been practicing using apostrophes for omission and possession as well as inverted commas to punctuate dialogue correctly. The children then had the opportunity to write a set of instructions for a guide to Hogwarts including things such as how to ride a broomstick and how to win a wizard duel. In maths, to finish off the statistics unit, we have been learning about pie charts. The children have practiced reading, interpreting and accurately drawing pie charts using percentages and fractions of the whole. We have now started another short sequence on ratio. This week, the children have been introduced to the ratio symbol and have discussed how it is similar and different to using fractions. In science, the children discussed the idea of evolution and looked at how peppered moths adapted to their environment during the Industrial Revolution. They made a comic strip style storyboard to retell the events of the evolution of the species. In RE, they explored the Hindu view of life being in stages and related this to their own lives and beliefs. Some of our children had the opportunity to compete in a cross-country event on Wednesday afternoon hosted by Monkleigh Primary School. Thank you to Mr Slocombe, Mr Walter & Mr Craker for facilitating this event through running club. The children are very proud of their achievements on the day! Have a brilliant weekend!
