In Owls Class this week the children have enjoyed finding a number of different ways to learn their tricky words! In maths, the children have continued to focus on the number 10. *Can you remember some of the different numbers we can put together to compose 10?*

Year 1— Mrs Keast

The highlight of the week was our trip to Exmoor Zoo on Thursday. We had wonderful sunny weather and saw a great selection of animals. We learned about animal classification and had a very informative talk from the staff.

In our Curious Quest this week we read *Dogger* by Shirley Hughes. We had fun creating a new house for Dogger, some even had swimming pools and a hot tub! We are beginning to use the purple pens to re-read and edit our writing.

In Maths we have been measuring length and height using rulers. *Could you have a go at measuring how tall you are?*

In RE we learned how Christians celebrate Easter and how churches are decorated for the occasion. Next week we will be spending the mornings on our "learning quizzes" which will form our Spring Term assessments. This afternoon we spent time on our DT project, creating shadow puppets.



Year 2—Mr Slocombe

Year 2 have been busy exploring their key text of the *Three Little Pigs* in English this week. We have sequenced key events, leading us to summarise the story. Then, we looked at the wolf's perspective and how that is similar and different to that of the pigs.

Maths has seen us finish our fractions sequence, learning about finding and recognising three quarters. Today, we began learning about mass, capacity and temperature by comparing the mass of different objects.

In science, we considered what plants need in order to successfully grow, using our own cress plants as examples.

History involved beginning to plan a 4-way comparison between nursing today, Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole and Edith Cavell!

Year 3- Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Manning

Another great week for the year 3s. They have begun the English sequence '*Monsters: An owner's guide*'. This has been exciting for the children after their factual writing last week and they have designed their own monster to prepare a guide for!

In maths they have excelled in their understanding of fractions. Their science learning about friction has enabled them to link with their history learning about how the Stone Age people made fire. Their previous science, leaning about rocks and property of materials has helped them to understand the chronology of the Stone Age, to Bronze then Iron Age and why and how these periods developed with greater understanding of materials and their properties.

In Taste it Tuesday they had their first liquid taste it- they loved the Boba tea and all had the chance to smell the jasmine green tea bag!











Year 4-Mr Walter

This week in English, Year 4 have researched multiple animals looking at our focus text of an Anthology of Intriguing Animals. From these found facts we have chosen an animal to create our own informational text including prepositions and conjunctions whilst focussing on the clear layout of our non-fiction text.

In maths, we have concluded our fractions sequence before starting our next sequence focusing on money. Our target this week, has been exploring the 8 coins we have in our currency. Challenging ourselves to meet a target number using a certain amount of coins. This has also allowed us to convert between pounds and pence whilst understanding the use of the decimal point in money.

On Thursday, we enjoyed the opportunity to join with Year 6 in playing diamond cricket on the field. We joined together in our tree groups to develop our batting and fielding techniques whilst working as a team. In history, we compared the differences and changes in the music industry from the 20th century to now.

Year 5— Mr Saltearn

A great week in Year 5! In English, we have been finishing our book *Cloud Busting* and have been creating our own poems with the title Isn't life. We have been thinking about all the things that we enjoy in life and creating a poem that illustrates these using the sentence stems Isn't life.

In Maths, we have started our sequence on statistics and we have been busy creating our own life graphs and then focusing on reading them and finding information from them.

This week in science we have been comparing the life cycle of a mammal and a bird and how they differ. The children worked in small groups to create their own videos that illustrated the differences in them and how their young are born.

In PE, we have continued to practice our skills in cricket and focused this week on defending we put these skills into a game.

Year 6-Miss McLean

On Tuesday afternoon, Year Six had a brilliant time visiting Chumleigh College for the North Devon Music Hub's Future Musicians event. The children thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to make music with a large ensemble and they played fantastically.

We have continued our grammar revision in English this week by looking at adverbials and parenthesis. The children have written their own pages about a magical object in a non-fiction style.

In maths, we have learnt about line graphs, bar charts and pie charts in statistics. The children had a go at interpreting pie charts with percentages before having a go at drawing some of their own.

In science, we discussed Charles Darwin's theory of evolution and the children created a story map of the evolution of the peppered moth. In history, we learnt about how the Shang Dynasty ended and finally in RE compared the life stages of a Hindu to our own.


