
Prior Knowledge

In EYFS, the children learnt about mapping and directions in Maths lessons, as well as festivals, celebrations and holidays around the world.

In Year 1, the children learnt about Our School and Where we Live. They also completed a unit of work on Position and Direction in Maths lessons.

The children have just completed a unit of work about the United Kingdom. They can name the four countries that make up the UK and have located them on maps.

My Component Knowledge:

Lesson 1: I can use an atlas to locate the continents and oceans of the world and label a world map.

Lesson 2: I can record some key facts about continents of the world.

Lesson 3: I can make a journey line around the world using key words to describe the journey.

Lesson 4: I can explain where hot and cold countries are located in the world and begin to name climate zones around the world using key words.

Lesson 5: I can find key features in aerial photographs using observational skills and use key words to describe the features seen.

Lesson 6: I can name some countries in Europe and know some facts about one of them.

My Composite Knowledge:

I can name, locate and identify the world's seven continents and five oceans using world maps, atlases and globes. I can use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key physical features and key human features. I can use simple compass directions and locational and directional language to describe the location of feature and routes on a map.

My Powerful Knowledge:

I am developing my understanding of how to describe similarities and differences, observe and identify features. I am developing my confidence in using a variety of different types of maps to locate places in the world.
