Owls Class have had another great week, incorporating all things 'superhero' into their learning and have particularly enjoyed practising their tricky words using the water pistols! They have also managed to keep one another cool with them this week too!

They have thoroughly enjoyed learning about the life cycle of a caterpillar, ordering the stages and creating their own lifecycles independently. Our class caterpillars have begun spinning their own cocoons which the children have been fascinated with. We can't wait to see what they look like after their metamorphosis!

In maths, we have moved on from learning about doubles, to work on sharing fairly. ## Year 1—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast

This week we continued with our English sequence based on the text 'What Happens When...' by Delphine Chedru. We have been breaking the story down into different elements and thinking about how we could alter the story to create our own version. We have thought about alternative items that could be lost and the magical things that might happen to them. We are beginning to plan our own individual stories which we will be writing independently.

In Maths we are now learning about place value and numbers to 100. We have been counting to 100 and back, thinking about the tens which we encounter as we count. We have been partitioning numbers and discussing what each digit represents in terms of tens and ones. Again making the most of the great weather and taking our learning outside to draw some chalk number lines.

In History we learned about rail travel during the Victorian era and how this enabled people to visit the seaside for a day out. We looked at some vintage seaside posters advertising various seaside locations and had a go at creating our own.

We had a great time in DT this week tasting lots of different fruits. Many children said it was the first time they had tasted some of them!

It is getting even hotter and the children are coping really well. Thank you for helping them with sunscreen in the mornings, it is so reassuring to see a generation of children who understand the dangers of the sun on their skin! Our classroom is the coolest in the school, and our outdoor area is shaded, so we really have been so lucky to enjoy this heat safely!

In science we tested the waterproof-ness of different materials—it wasn't what we hypothesised!

## Year 2—Miss Jones

It's been a super busy week in Year 2. In Maths we have been continuing with statistics and looked at creating our own pictograms, block diagrams and writing questions for each other to answer. In English we have been exploring our new instructional text through likes, dislikes, patterns and puzzles, learning and remembering the text with a story map and using our knowledge of the text to answer comprehension questions.

Then in History linking to Maths, we collected data using mentimeter to create a word cloud of our favourite foods. We discussed what we noticed and considered whether there were any similarities or differences between food choices now compared to the past.

In Science we continued exploring the uses of everyday materials by learning about recycling.

We were all interested to learn that it's not just paper we can recycle! As a class we sorted different examples of materials into the right recycling container and discussed whether we agreed or disagreed with each other.

The highlight of the week was our trip to Quince Honey Farm on

Thursday, we were certainly lucky with the weather!

Next we tasted and compared four different types of honey, before making our own beeswax candles and planting sunflower seeds. We ended our trip by having a game of bee bingo to find different objects around the gardens.


## Year 3—Mr Slocombe

Year 3 have enjoyed a hot week in school! We have made use of our new found water tray in our outdoor area to keep ourselves cool and recall learning relating to mass and capacity in maths.

In the classroom, we have been focusing on writing our shared version of the Paperbag Prince. Next week, we will be planning and writing our own versions.

In maths, we have continued with our sequence around time, telling the time to the nearest 5 minutes before focusing on reading clocks to the nearest minute. ***I wonder if you can tell the time at home this weekend?***

Science saw us learn more about light sources and reflectors. We learnt that light sources are objects that are capable of generating their own light. In history, we learnt about Celtic warriors, including how they lived, dressed and fought. Have a super weekend in the sunshine!



## Year 4—Miss McLean

We've had a lovely week in year four this week and have made the most of the lovely weather.

The children have been writing some independent tales in English this week and are all very proud of the work that they have produced. We spent time practicing and developing editing skills to improve our writing even further. Our next sequence will be based on the 'Book of Bones' by Gabrielle Balkin.

In maths we have finished our sequence on time by converting between 12- and 24-hour clocks using both analogue and digital representations. We have had some great discussions about am and pm time throughout the week. Our next sequence will be a short one on statistics including looking at and interpreting graphs and charts.

We found out that the Anglo-Saxons divided the country into seven kingdoms after they arrived from Germany, Denmark and Sweden. We also learnt that they came in tribes called the Angles, Saxons and Jutes and created maps to show this.

In science this week, we learnt about the organ in the digestive system and had a go at drawing and labelling them as well as describing and explaining their functions.

Finally, in PSHE we came up with our own definition of the key words *conflict* and *compromise*. The children then had a go at role playing a scenario where there was conflict and then a compromise was made to resolve it.

## Year 5—Mr Walter

Year 5 have continued to work fantastically well this week. In English, we have been finishing our writing on our created texts linking to our digital focus. We have been able to play editing bingo to see what key techniques of grammar and punctuation we have included in our writing and editing as appropriate. While looking into our next focus of the Dictionary of Difficult words to help expand our vocabulary. In maths, we have started a sequence focusing on position and direction we have been recalling our understanding of coordinates and how they can be plotted accurately in the first quadrant.

We have also been exploring how parachutes work with air resistance by conducting an experiment to test on an egg. In DT, we researched the importance of food safety and hygiene and in history we delved into a box of resources that link to the history of World War II and Winkleigh, finding some interesting facts and images and comparing them on our timeline. ## Y5 & Y6 SPORTS UPDATE



On Wednesday, we had our first experience of a cricket festival and it was brilliant. 16 children travelled to North Devon Cricket Club (Instow) and enjoyed the opportunity to play 4 matches each against other local schools. The format involved 40 balls per class with each batting pair getting 10 balls to score as many runs as they could. Everyone as always represented the school brilliantly with their fair play, support, excellent attitude and performance in warm conditions. Well done team!

Earlier in the year, we were able to take our first netball team out to play some matches versus Hatherleigh and we were thrilled when they asked us back for another fixture. However, this time we were able to take two teams of 7 players due to the increased desire to play netball across the school. Once more, there were some fantastic examples of key skills and techniques with the games being end to end and very entertaining. Overall, in the 4 games played we ended winning 20-12 which reflects all the hard work everyone put in. Thank you to all parents for transporting. We look forward to welcoming Hatherleigh to us soon.

## Year 6—Mr Davis

Year 6 have certainly managed to pack a lot of things into this week!

In English, the children have been continuing their sequence about Greek Mythology by considering the tale in the Odyssey when Odysseus meets Polyphemus. The children have written a section as a class, written a section in pairs and then finished the tale on their own. They have all really considered the characterisation of Odysseus in this first person piece of work.


In Maths, the children have started their penultimate maths sequence - Converting Measures. This week, they have looked at converting and calculating metric measures and have started to look at converting metric and imperial measures.

In Science this week, Year 6 have learnt about why exercise is so important to our heart, physical and mental health. They then had to create advice for younger children as to why they should exercise every day.

This week's philosophy lesson built upon the last runaway train thought experiment and involved the class imagining that they were the programmers working on the new automated, driverless vehicles. They were presented with scenarios and had to decide how they would program their vehicles to react.



In Art, the children have learnt about drawing using 1-point perspective and how this can create the illusion of three dimensions on their work.



Year 6's History lesson involved learning about the differences between Athenians and Spartans and why this made their battles and exchanges so interesting to historians.

Finally, congratulations to all of the children who took part in sporting events this week. The cricket took place in an amazing spot and we were complimented on our behaviour. Also, another successful outing for the Year 6 football team and the Year 5/6 netball team.

## Should I keep my child off school?

### Yes

#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

### No

but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

### Are you entitled?

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
