
The children were very excited to be able to watch our first butterfly emerge from its cocoon on Thursday which has linked well to our topic of growth and change in PSED.

## Year 1—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast

This week we have been busy with our reading quizzes. Towards the end of the week we continued with our English sequence and we have been writing our own magical stories, imagining what might happen to some everyday objects if we were to lose them. We have been remembering how to correctly punctuate our sentences by adding a question mark at the end. Next week we will complete this sequence and then move onto instruction writing using the text 'Slime' – we are all looking forward to it!

In Maths we have been consolidating our learning about place value and numbers to 100. We have been using dienes to make numbers to 100 and have been thinking about one more and one less.

In RE we learned about the Jewish festival of Hanukkah and how families enjoy celebrating this event. We created our own menorah lamps which featured nine candles.

In History we have looked at the activities we enjoy on seaside holidays today and how some of these are the same as those enjoyed by people in the Victorian era.



## Year 2—Miss Jones

Another week has flown by and we have been very busy in class. In English we have been exploring and responding to our focus instructional text before looking at adverbs and time openers. We have been generating instructions and practicing structuring these clearly in our books.

In Maths we have been continuing with statistics by collecting, presenting and interpreting our own data. So far we have looked at our favourite animals, school dinner choices and seasons. In History this week we constructed a timeline and ordered different foods relating to the era that they came from. We recognised several dishes that we eat in the present day and were surprised that they were actually enjoyed in the past too!

In Science we learned all about the inventor John McAdam linking to our current learning about the uses of everyday materials. We discovered that he invented tarmac which is named after him. This improved the conditions of the roads and made them safer. We learned lots of facts about him and discussed why his invention is so significant.

Preparations are underway for sports day and we have been practicing for the events in PE this week. Have a good weekend everyone.


We are looking forward to an exciting week with sports day and our residential next week! Have a super weekend!




## Year 4—Miss McLean




## Year 5—Mr Walter

## Should I keep my child off school?

### Yes

#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

### Are you entitled?

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
