## Nursery (Squirrels & Hedgehogs)—Mrs Stapley



We have thought about old and new transport and talked about steam and electric trains to link to our amazing trip to the Train Centre on Thursday.

In R.E we looked at The Torah Scroll and talked about special books and artefacts belonging to different religions. The children had lots of very sensible questions related to this.

In maths we have been practising counting on from a given number using the terms FIRST, THEN and NOW to make up number stories.

On Wednesday, the children were very excited to have their P.E session with our visiting athlete Bex Rayner. They enjoyed learning new stretches and taking part in a variety of warm up exercises and skills.

As always the children were a real credit to themselves during our trip on Thursday. They loved the different train rides around the magic woods and alongside the river, enjoyed looking at the miniature railways, and thoroughly enjoyed exploring all the different play areas. It was wonderful to see them looking after one another, playing together, and talking about different types of transport and journeys using some fantastic language. Well done Owls. ## Year 1—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast

We have been applying our writing skills this week in English, creating a 'lift the flap book' all about Sri Lankan animals. We have remembered lots of interesting facts about the various animals and have used them in our written work. We also illustrated them so that our book closely resembled the Ocean book which we have been reading for the sequence of learning.

In Maths this week we completed our learning about multiplication and division. We have been sharing quantities into equal groups and have also ensured that we are confident when doubling quantities.

In Geography we looked at Sri Lanka and began creating a map of the country. We learned what Sri Lanka is famous for and watched a video about some of the food which are eaten there. We discussed similarities and differences between Sri Lanka and our homes here in Winkleigh.

We enjoyed the Coronation picnic and celebrations and have also learned about the ceremony which will take place at the weekend. We hope everyone has a lovely long Coronation weekend!



## Year 2—Miss Jones

It's been another successful week in Year 2 and we have most certainly been making the most of the lovely sunshine! In Maths we have continued with our fractions sequence and have explored the equivalence of  $\frac{1}{2}$  and  $\frac{3}{4}$ , finding  $\frac{3}{4}$  of an amount and counting in fractions practically before we move on to time. The children have really impressed me with their understanding of this topic and have shown confidence in applying key vocabulary in their explanations.

In English we have been doing a shared write, piecing together what we have learned relating to grammar so far. We had a go at structuring our information using two voices and up-levelling our sentences to include effective vocabulary choices. In Science we enjoyed taking our learning outdoors to identify examples of man-made and natural materials around us in our school environment. The children shared insightful ideas linking to what they know about where objects come from, what they are used for and their properties.

In Art we worked collaboratively to practice moulding cardboard to replicate scales. We used papier mache and used our fingers to bend parts of the cardboard so that they looked 3D and more realistic.

Wednesday was a highlight of the week as Bex Rayner visited our school. We enjoyed learning about what it's like to be an athlete and taking part in a circuit training practical activity.

## Year 3—Mr Slocombe

Year 3 have enjoyed the sunshine this week! We have been busy in maths, comparing the capacities of different objects, recording which were larger or smaller using  $<$   $>$   $=$  symbols. We have also added volume and capacity, using our prior learning about addition and subtraction.

During English, we have made our own monsters and practised writing a set of instructions based on this. Next week, we will be writing our own guides for caring for monsters. We have embedded our understanding of imperative verbs and time adverbials within our writing.

In science, we set up an investigation to find out more about how water travels through a plant. The children cut celery and placed it in water with red food colouring. We will be looking at the results next week, as well as planting our broad bean plants from Rosemoor in the school's garden.

Geography saw us learn more about life in Poland, including facts about the landscape, food and population.

Yesterday, we began our art sequence, (after a couple of Thursdays out of class!), learning more about the sculptures created by Louise Bourgeois.

## Year 4—Miss McLean



We've had another fantastic week in Year Four! In English we have finished our learning based around the book 'An anthology of intriguing animals' by making a class book. We used non-fiction books to research about our chosen animals before writing about them in the style of our focus text.

In maths we have moved on to learning about money. We have learnt to convert between pounds and pence and compare amounts of money.



We looked at different types of landscapes in North America in our geography lesson and made some posters to show our top 5 places to visit. We found out that as North America is such a huge continent, there is a huge range of landscape types.

We learnt to use dichotomous keys in science to classify animals. Asking yes or no questions helped us to work out which animals belonged where in our classification keys.



Finally, we enjoyed meeting Bex Rayner on Wednesday and worked hard to complete the circuit activities that we were sponsored for. Year Four had some fantastic questions to ask her and listened attentively to her responses.

## Year 5—Mr Walter

It has been fantastic to welcome some sunshine this week! Year 5 have been working hard to use relative clause to build their own poems of hope. Additionally, we had a challenge to think of a food and describe it without giving away what our chosen food was.

In maths, we have completed our short learning sequence on statistics by focusing on our class timetable which we drew and plotted to answer questions.

In science, we have spent time comparing two theories of our solar system. First, we looked into the meaning of the heliocentric theory and spoke if we agreed or if we believed a geocentric way of thinking. In Geography, we were able to explore our own carbon footprint while focussing on the meaning of fossil fuels.

Well done and thank you to everyone who sponsored and took part for our Sports Champions Events, the class did amazingly well in the activities on Wednesday and made a fantastic effort to celebrate the coronation.

Year 6 have really been flying this week! In English, we have started a new sequence centred around a novel called Floodland. The story involves a familiar yet strange setting and characters that the children can relate to. The story opener has already provoked some interesting conversations.

In maths, the children have been recapping some of the concepts and skills that they have wanted to revise. They have included fractions, percentages and money. In ICT this week, Year 6 have moved on from stop motion animation to editing short sections of video using a story board as a guide. Their learning task this week was to create a film trailer that displayed what spring looks like at Winkleigh Primary. Look forward to some of their efforts being published on the school Facebook page next week.

In PE this week, Mr Walter has continued to teach the children how to be mentors for Sports Day and how they can support the younger children to complete the activities they will be competing in. Year 6 really enjoyed having Bex Rayner into visit them on Wednesday. They had some really insightful questions for her about the pathways into the sport and how her career is progressing - especially regarding her nutritionist and meeting Zlatan Ibrahimovic!

## Should I keep my child off school?

### Yes

#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

### Are you entitled?

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
