Firstly, thank you very much for all the lovely cards and gifts you gave the nursery staff at the end of the term. It was very kind of you.

The Nursery team and I hope you had a fantastic Christmas break, and we can't wait to see all the children and hear their holiday news!

Our topic this term is 'The Day of the Dinosaurs'. We will encourage the children to engage in conversations about dinosaurs and learn new vocabulary. This will include hearing and learning rich story vocabulary and retelling our own stories through role play and small world activities. We will also be discussing and experiencing the seasonal changes as they occur throughout the term.

Helpful reminders:

Stay and Play

2pm-3pm every Friday. All families with babies and toddlers welcome.

Naming Clothing, Bags and Lunchboxes.

The end of the day can be tricky for little ones. Can we please ask you to clearly name coats/sweatshirts/bags and lunchboxes. By managing their own belongings, it will encourage the children to become more independent.

Toileting

Please keep us up to date with any toileting needs. If your child needs to use nappies and wipes these need to be sent in from home and please include nappy sacks.

Uniform

Uniform is not compulsory, and children are obviously more than welcome to wear their own clothes. However, if you would like to order a Nursery T-shirt and Sweatshirt, they can be ordered from our uniform supplier Instant Images in Torrington. Please see the school website for more details.

We don't recommend that children wear their best outfits to nursery as we encourage them to spend time exploring the different activities on offer and these can often include using resources that can be a bit messy!

Footwear- please send children into nursery wearing shoes that they can move freely in i.e. trainers or canvas shoes.

Snack

Fruit is provided for both morning and afternoon snack. The children have a choice of milk or water. We promote independence by encouraging the children to pour their own drinks and peel their own fruit. If you would also like to provide a water bottle for use throughout the day, please name it and we will keep it in the snack area where it will be accessible throughout the day. If you do wish to provide a water bottle, please ensure it contains only water.

Development scrap books and assessments

Nursery staff will gather observational evidence to assess your child's development under the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum. You will receive two reports about your child's progress, and we will update you on their next steps during the termly parent's evening.

At the end of their time with us you will be given a scrapbook containing photographs, artwork etc. as a memento of their nursery journey.
